The anglers and guides involved with the Brandon Thornton Fund Raiser Spot Tournament, organized by the staff at Skeeter Lagoon's Bait and Tackle in Titusville, had a tough weather day on June 11th for fishing but still managed to raise over \$12,000 for Brandon and his family.

Ed Killer and his 6 yr. old son Conrad, eagerly wait each year to participate in the Florida Oceanographic Challenge (FOC). This year's event drew 126 inshore despite foul weather. This is a family level fishing tournament organized with two purposes in mind: to raise awareness for the many activities and efforts of the FOS, and to raise money for the Treasure Coast Fishing Center and Gamefish Lagoon, both presently in develop-

ment.

Tournament organizand founder of Florida Sportsman Magazine. Karl Wickstrom stated, "We're very pleased with the record-setting turnout we saw this year," he said. "We may have to cut off the number of entries in a few years. Next year we fully expect to be able to collect some of the fish caught in this event for the lagoon."

The FOC Professional Division

champion award went to Capt. Jerry Metz of Fort Pierce for the second consecutive year. Metz also won the FOC Open division in its first year. Metz used live mojarra to catch a 22-inch trout and a 28-inch redfish for top rod. Finishing a close runner-up was Steve Ferrise with a 26-inch snook and a 15-inch pompano.

Little Conrad Killer was a third-peat winner of the Kids Division fishing with dad and his great-uncle Capt. Bob Pelosi with 15 species. Just accounting for the longest single fish of each species, it added up to 207 total inches of fish! Included in the young angler's catch was his first bonefish caught near the St. Lucie Inlet. Zachary Scherer of Port St. Lucie took second with 168 total inches of fish and Casey Zeldon's 119 inches collected third. About 100 people attended the awards barbecue at the FOS Sunday.

Gary Giles, released 136 of the 200-plus tarpon sampled in last year's Tarpon Fishing for Science Tournament. Gary will graciously be acting tournament director for Jon Shenker; while Jon travels out of the country. There is also a tagging program connect to the tournament this year and it will run through Oct. 31. Entry fee is \$30 a person, or \$60 for a family. Those involved in the tagging segment will pay \$50. Entries can be made at any time. Prizes will be awarded.
